Reports were presented and viewed by the Board

Amy Coleman said the lake is open and running! The health inspector gave her the ok and said everything looks good. She put up a poster about the swimmer's inch. It's something that every lake has, the best thing to do is wash your body off after swimming. Amy is working on getting rid of the grass that is growing along the shore line. The teachers are starting to bring the school kids down to the lake. Letters went home to all the parents about swimming lessons, which will start in July. The lifeguards are using a zoomshift app for scheduling, which has worked out well. Amy also has the lifeguards hooked up with Survey 123 and WISPA to do boat checks in and out of the water. The lifeguard classes will start soon. There are about 3-4 new guards so hopefully after the class is done they will come work at the lake. Amy did mention that there were a few things that the Town park needed. One being an update to the beach house and another one she would like to see the swingset moved over to the beach side so that kids aren't having to cross the road way to get back and forth. She would also like the beach raked weekly and the speed bumps put back on the road way. Steve Johnson said he will contact Dylan Webb and get an estimate on painting the boathouse. Steve also said there were some tree branches that needed to be taken down. Greg has new signage going up on various locations at the park.

Diane VanSlyke, Town Historian wasn't able to make the meeting, but she sent in her report. She has been working very hard on the 250 American Project that will be held on July 12 from 11-1pm at the Indian Opening Cemetery, with lunch to follow at Hotel Solsville. Lunch will be \$25.00 with \$5.00 of it donated to the Town of Madison 250 America Project. It's going to be a wonderful celebration. I hope to see everyone come out and support Diane and the rest of the volunteers that have put a lot of time into this celebration. Terry signs made a beautiful banner and a sandwich board with details on the cemetery projects on one side and the Patriot Historic Marker Dedication on the other. Diane has also been spending numerous hours with other projects as well.

Jeff said junk days went very well. The men have been cutting shoulders and putting up signs on Love Joy Rd, patching up potholes, mowing, working on equipment in the shop, installing culverts on Hall Rd along with ditching and hauling crusher run. The boys went up to Fuess Rd to try and repair the road the best they could. After a busy month they will get to enjoy some much needed time off to enjoy with their families. Jeff said the gradall is still down Alta came in to do a diagnosis and it needs a rotary contact. The estimated cost is about \$4600 plus labor. The broom is also down, it needs a new alternator and battery. The service man for Milton Cat came down to update the computer on the loader. Jeff said he received the chips letter and the grand total is \$333,409.92. Jeff had the boys put up the town speed sensor sign up on South St at the top of the hill to try and slow down vehicles that go flying up and down the hill. Residents that live in the area are worried about their children and animals when people continue to speed through that area.

Greg announced that on June 15 they will be installing a new culvert on east Lake Rd the road will be shut down for about a month. The dam project is coming along well. Lake Moraine looks so different with so much water gone, but it is for a good cause so we all have to be thankful for that. The dam is going to look beautiful when they are finished.

Pat Kitchen, new owner of the Madison Trailer Park has been doing a wonderful job cleaning up the park and fixing up the drive ways. He has about 5-6 new trailers coming in. Greg said he is working with Larry the Codes enforcer to get everything up to codes.

The June Madison- Bouckville show was the best they have ever had. Let's pray the August show will follow. I drove through and there were many people out walking the street along with many food vendors this year. It's such an honor to have well known shows in our area that bring in people from all over the states.
