

PRESENT: Supervisor Greg Reuter- Deputy Supervisor, Patty Bikowsky, Councilpersons Jim Lundrigan & Brad Dixon, Town Clerk Tina Livermore , Highway Superintendent Jeff Bailey, Historian Diane VanSlyke and 4 guests.

Supervisor Greg Reuter opened the meeting at 7:00 pm followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

AGENDA: Patty Bikowsky made the motion seconded by Jim Lundrigan to accept the agenda. Motion carried.

MINUTES: Minutes from the January 2, 2026 meeting were read by Town Clerk Tina Livermore. Jim Lundrigan made a motion seconded by Brad Dixon to accept the minutes as read. Motion carried.

REPORTS: Supervisor's Report; Highway Supt. Report; Town Clerk Report; Dog Control Officer Report; Bookkeeper Report; Code Enforcer Report; Court Justice Report: Reports were presented and viewed by the Board.

Greg announced that the Solsville bridge work will probably start again in April. They will be working on the concrete deck and finishing up what they couldn't get done last year because of the weather change.

The drawdown for the Lake Moraine Dam has started. The canal corp has put up safety barriers and fences to keep the snowmobilers & four wheeler away. There have been some cornered issues on the docks and ice when the water flows out.

Larry, our Codes Officer, has been busy completing all his 2026 training. There is a lot of training that a code officer has to do to keep up with all the new and changing state code regulations.

Larry did an inspection of our highway garage to make sure everything is up to state code regulations. He did find some outdated issues that he is working on with Jeff. One of the biggest issues is getting all the electricity in compliance.

Jeff reached out to a few contractors for a bid on the work at the highway garage. J&D Family construction and J&K Platinum Construction. J&D Family Construction was the lowest bid.

Patty Bikowsky made a motion, seconded by Jim Lundrigan to accept J&D Family Construction for all the highway repairs. Motion carried

Brad Dixon made a motion, seconded by Jim Lundrigan to use the covid money to pay for the repairs on the town highway garage. Motion carried

Chapin Surveying will be surveying the property as the line is close to our salt shed.

Jeff said that the guys have been cleaning up around the town building and would like permission to get rid of some of the old outdated equipment and scrap metal that they don't use. One being truck #24 that Jeromie Nelson would like to buy. Shayne Winton would like to buy the old generator.

Patty Bikowsky made a motion, seconded by Jim Lundrigan to sell truck #24 to Jeromie Nelson for \$10,000.00 and the old generator to Shayne Winton for \$100. Motion carried

Jeff said the guys have been busy plowing and sanding. When there is any down time they work on truck repair and maintenance. They have also been cleaning up the roads. Spring is just around the corner!

Jeff has been looking for a track skid steer as it would come in handy for some of the road work and old jobs they do. He is also looking into a single axle dump truck with a plow . The one they have now that holds the brine isn't big enough for it so it's wearing the truck down.

Dog enumeration is done. We will start charging the \$5.00 per month late fee (per our local dog law) on any dog licence that is late. Please keep your dogs licensed and rabies vaccination up to date to avoid any extra penalties.

I asked the board about getting some fireproof cabinet/file or building a small records room at the town office. As I have vital record books that I have nothing to put them in along with other documents that should be in fire proof containers. Unfortunately I can't store them in my records room which is down in the highway building because I have to have easy access to them in my office.

Patty Bikowsky made a motion, seconded by Jim Lundrigan to look into the cabinets or other alternatives.

Greg said the Village of Madison no longer will be doing the Memorial day parade, he asked if we would like to take it over.

Brad Dixon made a motion and seconded by Patty Bikowsky to have the Town take over the responsibility of the parade. Motion carried.

Greg said the DMV will be closed from the 13th-18th for system updates.

Greg announced that the Town would like to purchase the Village hall from the Mayor for \$1.00 in agreement that the Village employees would still have use of the buildings and their office would stay the same.

There were no public presentations at the meeting.

Patty Bikowsky made a motion seconded by Brad Dixon to pay the General Bills in the amount of \$573,104.33 and the highway bills in the amount of \$31,317.95 with a grand total of \$604,422.28 Motion carried.
